Check in and Check out:

Check in time is Sunday, July 14, 2024 from 4 pm to 5 pm in the main lobby of Catlett Hall, the residence hall where students will stay for the duration of the workshop. For those arriving to Iowa City on Interstate 80, take the Dubuque Street exit going south. Turn right on Church Street, which curves and turns into Clinton St. Look for Catlett Residence Hall, 350 North Madison Street, Iowa City, IA 52242. The North Campus Parking Ramp is located just behind Burge Residence Hall, with access via Madison Street. If you park in this ramp, on level 4, you'll find the walkway to Catlett Residence Hall. The main desk where you'll check in is located at Entrance 11.

Check out time is Thursday, July 18, 2024 at Noon in Catlett Hall. However, if your family would like to attend the Closing Ceremony, they are welcome to attend! Please RSVP the number of family members attending. The Closing Ceremony takes place 10:30-11:30 a.m. in room 101 Becker Communication Studies Building, Iowa City, IA 52242 (on Madison Street, in front of Adler Journalism Building). We'll be giving out awards and celebrating our accomplishments and friendships. There will be pizza and soda in Adler Rotunda after the awards. Then everyone will head over to Catlett to check out. Everyone should be checked out of their rooms by 2:00 pm.

Early/Late Departure

If you will be arriving early or late to ISJW, be sure to let us know by Friday, June 24, 2024 so we can accommodate your needs.

Students Parking on Campus

Students who drive to ISJW and need to park cars while attending camp will need to make parking arrangements either in a city ramp or by contacting Parking Services in the West Campus Transportation Center (319-335-1475). Campers will not be allowed to drive during camp unless specific arrangements are made due to an appointment or other circumstance.

Campers will need to surrender their car keys to the head counselor on Sunday. You must contact the director, Michelle Sillman (<u>michelle-sillman@uiowa.edu</u>) as soon as you are aware of any appointments or reasons campers will need to leave during camp.

In late May, we'll be sending an email to the student email account we have listed. This email will direct the student on how to complete the credential process for using our computers on campus. Please be sure the student email will accept this email from the University of Iowa. If you need to provide us with another email address for the student, other than the one provided during registration, please let me know. This process needs to be completed before the start of camp.

Catlett Residence Hall

The residence hall students are staying in is Catlett. It's located at 350 North Madison Street, Iowa City, IA 52242. Rooms are air-conditioned. Sheets, a pillow, pillowcases, and bedspread (blankets upon request) will be provided, but if students prefer, they may bring their own. To avoid confusion with residence hall linens, we recommend that students not bring white bedding. You must bring your own towels. The towels must not be white. As is common in college residence halls, bathrooms are located down the hall from the student rooms; students may wish to bring bathrobes and waterproof sandals to wear to and from the showers. All university furniture provided in the rooms at check-in must remain in each room throughout

summer camp. Students will be issued a room key, which must be returned to the residence hall at checkout. Students who don't return their keys will be charged \$25.
